President Announces "National Moderation Campaign" to Disseminate Accurate Information on Islam

3 February 2022



President Ibrahim Mohamed Solih has announced a nation-wide campaign called the "National Moderation Campaign" in an effort to combat extremist ideologies. President Solih made his remarks during the Presidential Address at the opening of the People's Majlis for the year 2022 at the first session of the Parliament this year.

During his remarks, President Solih stated that the government placed a high value on providing the public with accurate information about Islam, as well as fostering youth who adhere to Islamic principles and values. The President also stated that the campaign would be carried out with the

UK Minister of State for South and Central Asia, the UN and the Commonwealth Lord Tariq Ahmad of Wimbledon has paid a courtesy call on Minister of Defence Uza. Mariya Didi.

During the meeting held at the Ministry of Defence, Minister Mariya thanked the UK Government for the excellent cooperation and assistance extended to the Maldives, especially in the Defence and Security Sector, signaling fresh impetus to a positive diplomatic trajectory in the past 3 years.

The Minister welcomed the opening of a new chapter in the two countries' age-old security relationship, after a gap of over 10 years, in the form of training programs and exercises with the MNDF.

The Minister noted that, despite COVID-19, Britain opened up its prestigious military institutions to Maldivian servicemen, allowing the continuation of a tradition that has produced key leaders including

many General Officers.

Further discussions were held on boosting UK-Maldives cooperation in key areas of mutual interest, such as counterterrorism, aviation security, humanitarian assistance, and narcotrafficking.

The UK Minister of State Lord Ahmad highlighted the UK Government's commitment to boosting cooperation with the Maldives, and welcomed the Maldivian Government's interest in fostering human rights and democracy.

The Minister was joined by Vice Chief of Defence Force BG Abdul Raheem Abdul Latheef, Military Secretary BG Abdul Matheen Ahmed, DIDC Principal Director LTC Ahmed Shareef, Director General of Aviation Security Administration Hussain Nazeef, Director of NCTC LTC Ibrahim Naeem and Operations Director of Aviation Security Command Major Ahmed Shafeeq.

DG of NCTC Brigadier General (Retd) Zakariyya Mansoor and Director Lieutenant Colonel Ibrahim Naeem presented the brief in a meeting held at the Headquarters of Maldives National Defence Force.

In addition to the situation of the Maldives, NCTC also briefed the work done by NCTC in P/CVE in the Maldives.

The Secretary General also called upon Minister of Defence Uza. Mariya Didi during his visit. During his call, Sheikh Dr Mohammad bin Abdulkarim Al-Issa spoke highly of His Excellency President Ibrahim Mohamed Solih's Zero Tolerance Policy on Terrorism and Violent Extremism, and the

Government's approach to implementing this policy through a whole-of-government and whole-of-society approach.

The 2-day program focused on standard-setting in PVE strategies to prevent youth and women from engaging in violent extremism and terrorism.

Director General of NCTC Brigadier General (Rtd)) Zakariyya Mansoor delivered the opening remarks. He highlighted that empowering women and youth could no longer be relegated to the periphery. He also called for inclusion of gender and youth perspectives at the front and center of all policies.

The training program was attended by practitioners from stakeholder agencies in the Maldives as well as participants from South and South East Asia.


