

NCTC Conducts "Workshop to Review the National Action Plan on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism 2020-2024"

2-3 May 2023



The workshop was collaboratively organized by the Ministry of Islamic Affairs, with technical support provided by the United Nations Development Program (UNDP). This two-day workshop specifically targeted officials from key stakeholder agencies identified under the National Action Plan for Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism.

The primary objectives of the workshop were:

- Strengthen the monitoring and evaluation processes associated with the implementation of the NAP. This aimed to enhance the effectiveness of the plan in addressing and mitigating the risks of violent extremism and terrorism.
- Identify and address the challenges encountered in the implementation of the NAP. Through open discussions and sharing of experiences, participants sought to find ways to overcome obstacles and improve the overall

effectiveness of their efforts.

Enhance coordination and collaboration among various government agencies and sectors of society by streamlining and improving the work carried out as part of the "whole-ofgovernment" and "whole-of-society" approach. This approach emphasizes the collective involvement and cooperation of all relevant stakeholders to effectively prevent and counter violent extremism and terrorism.

Minister of Higher Education Dr. Ibrahim Hassan officiated the opening session. In his remarks, he highlighted the importance of coordination at the national level for a comprehensive response to prevent violent extremism in all its forms.

The NAP was first published in 2020 as a research-based whole-of-nation effort to address a broad spectrum of factors in cross-cutting sectors that make people fall victim to extremist ideologies.

NCTC Holds Follow-On Discussions with Stakeholders to Finalize Revisions to the National Action Plan on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism

NCTC conducted a series of follow-on discussions with stakeholders to finalize revisions to the National Action Plan on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism. The discussions took place throughout the month of May, building on the outcomes of the previous workshop held to review the existing NAP.

The primary objective of these discussions was to engage with stakeholders to delve deeper into the suggestions and revisions proposed during the earlier workshop, ensuring that the National Action Plan aligns with the evolving needs and challenges of preventing and countering violent extremism.

As of now, the NCTC has successfully conducted meetings with key ministries and agencies, including the Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Gender, Family and Social Services, Ministry of Higher Education, and the National Reintegration Centre. These meetings have laid a solid foundation for the revision of the National Action

Plan on P/CVE, and further engagements with additional stakeholders are anticipated in the coming months.

The revisions to the National Action Plan on P/CVE, driven by these follow-on discussions, hold the potential to strengthen the Maldives' capabilities in preventing and countering violent extremism. By integrating the perspectives of various stakeholders and leveraging international expertise, the revised plan will serve as a comprehensive framework to address the multifaceted aspects of this complex challenge in a collaborative and inclusive approach to address the threat of violent extremism.

The 6-day program involved participants from various sectors of society including youth, senior educators, and community leaders. The sessions were designed to provide participants with the necessary tools and knowledge to build a cohesive and resilient community.

The sessions prioritize the dissemination of crucial information aimed at enabling individuals to recognize the root causes of violent extremism and terrorism, commonly referred to as the "push and pull factors." These programs actively encourage participants to tackle these factors through a cooperative "whole-of-society" approach.

The Ministry of Youth, Sports and Community Empowerment and the NCTC have been working together to strengthen community resilience and prevent violent extremism in the Maldives. This collaboration has led to the development of a range of initiatives and programs aimed at promoting community empowerment and countering extremism.

The success of these programs and initiatives is evident in the increased awareness of the

knowledge and tools necessary to identify and understand the underlying factors that contribute to the spread of violent extremism. By fostering a comprehensive understanding of these factors, participants are empowered to address them collectively, bringing together various sectors of society to collaborate on effective strategies and solutions.

In addition to Youth Ministry, NCTC partnered with Ministry of Education, Ministry of Islamic Affairs, Maldives Police Service, and Islamic University of
