In an increasingly complex world where conflicts and crises persist, one fundamental principle remains an unwavering beacon of hope and humanity: the protection of civilians and their infrastructure. It is a moral imperative, a legal obligation, and a cornerstone of global peace and security.

Amidst the turmoil of war, the international community stands united in its resolve to ensure the safety and well-being of civilians caught in the crossfire. The Geneva Conventions and their Additional Protocols have long served as the backbone of humanitarian law, emphasizing the inviolability of civilians in armed conflicts. The message is clear: civilians must be respected and protected at all times.

A Pillar of International Law: The foundation of these principles lies in the principle of distinction, which mandates a clear separation between combatants and non-combatants. Civilians are individuals who do not take a direct part in hostilities, and their safety is sacrosanct. This foundational principle is the bedrock upon which all international humanitarian law is built.

Ministry of Youth, Sports and Community Empowerment Conducts “Hafthaares” in Alif Alif Atoll in Collaboration with NCTC

The Ministry of Youth, Sports and Community Empowerment, in collaboration with the National Counter Terrorism Centre conducted a "Hafthaares" program in AA. Ukulhas. This program is aimed at promoting community empowerment and strengthening resilience against extremism and terrorism.

The 6-day program involved participants from various sectors of society including youth, senior educators, and community leaders. The sessions were designed to provide participants with the necessary tools and knowledge to build a cohesive and resilient community.

The sessions prioritize the dissemination of crucial information aimed at enabling individuals to recognize the root causes of violent extremism and terrorism, commonly referred to as the "push and pull factors." These programs actively encourage participants to tackle these factors through a cooperative "whole-of-society" approach.

The Ministry of Youth, Sports and Community Empowerment and the NCTC have been working together to strengthen community resilience and prevent violent extremism in the Maldives. This collaboration has led to the development of a range of initiatives and programs aimed at promoting community empowerment and countering extremism.

The success of these programs and initiatives is evident in the increased awareness of the knowledge and tools necessary to identify and understand the underlying factors that contribute to the spread of violent extremism. By fostering a comprehensive understanding of these factors, participants are empowered to address them collectively, bringing together various sectors of society to collaborate on effective strategies and solutions.



In addition to Youth Ministry, NCTC partnered with Ministry of Education, Ministry of Islamic Affairs, Maldives Police Service, and Islamic University of Maldives to conduct a variety of sessions concerning community empowerment. NCTC also conducted awareness sessions for parents, teachers and senior students of AA. Rasdhoo, AA.Thoddoo, AA.Himandho, AA.Mathiveri, AA.Bodufolhudhoo, AA.Maalhos and AA.Feridhoo.
