MALDIVES AS A BEACON OF LIGHT FOR THE ISLAMIC UMMAH ON MODERATION AND PEACE

Ministry of Islamic Affairs of the Maldives hosts the first High Level Seminar on the "Role of Moderation in Counter Terrorism and Promoting Peace and Security" in Kurumba Maldives in collaboration with Global Forum for Moderation of the Hashimite Kingdom of Jordan, NCTC, MPS and MNDF. The two-day seminar was held on 14th and 15th of April 2018 and was attended by 26 eminent Scholars and Statesmen from 13 Islamic Nations and scholars and academicians from Maldives.

The main objective of the Seminar was to facilitate dialogue at the international and National level amongst the eminent Scholars and Statesmen to promote multi-dimensional understanding of the threat of radicalism and extremism and to promote the real image of Islam which is based on justice, fairness and compassion.

The seminar emphasized on the role of moderation and moderate approaches in the global security. Furthermore, it emphasized on the threats of terrorism and violent extremism which saps the energies and potential of the Muslim World. During the seminar, it has been highlighted the true face of Islam which is based on justice and compassion in dealing with all human kind, respecting humanity and human dignity. The seminar concluded with the adoption of the following recommendations:

- To proclaim the real image of Islam which is based on Justice, Fairness and Compassion
- To condemn and respond in a more comprehensive manner through adoption of more comprehensive, effective and unified strategy.
- The global effort to be supervised by a committee of judges
- Extremism has no religion and any linkage to any religion will only help the terrorists in achieving their goals





- To pay more attention to youth, and the marginalized poor community and utilize Zakat to rehabilitate
- To fight illiteracy, poverty and ignorance and to spread values that are against extremism and terrorism
- Educational institutions in Islamic countries to include faith-based concepts to fight terrorism and violent extremism in their curriculum/syllabus.
- Expressed regret that there is a growing intolerance against Muslims and Islamophobia violates the Muslim's fundamental human rights and dignity
- Appealed to the global media to identify and portray the true nature of Islam and to avoid deliberate distortions of the image of Islam
- Emphasized the importance of family and the role of women in guiding young minds away from terrorism

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION/ENGAGEMENTS

DG MEETS US SENATE APPROPRIATION COMMITTEE



Director General Brigadier General Zakariyya Mansoor met with the director and the senior delegation of United States Senate Appropriation Committee on 05 April 2018. During the meeting, NCTC provided a presentation on the role of National Counter Terrorism Centre and Maldives' approach to violent counter terrorism and extremism. Furthermore, during the meeting Director General of National Counter Terrorism Centre and the Director of the Senate Appropriations Committee discussed mutual interests and specific areas for mutual cooperation.

NCTC AT UN SUB-REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON NATIONAL CVE STRATEGY

A delegation from NCTC participated at the Subregional workshop on Afghanistan, the Maldives and Sri Lanka focusing on national CVE strategies, conducted from 14 to 16 March 2018 in New York. The program was organized by the UN Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED) to promote the adoption and implementation of national strategies to counter violent extremism. The format of the three day program enabled the participants to discuss ways to strengthen national and regional informationexchange networks, and to promote cooperation among counter-terrorism officials from the region, especially those focusing on countering violent extremism. During the program, Maldives presented a brief on Maldives' approaches to counter terrorism and violent extremism in the Maldives.

COUNTER RADICALIZATION COMMITTEE MEETING HELD



conducted the Counter Radicalization Committee meeting to discuss challenges faced by the institutions of the committee members in addressing the issues related to the spread of violent extremism and radicalization in the Maldives. The meeting was attended by members from designated ministries, and was presided over by the committee chairman, Minister of Defence and National Security Honorable. Adam Shareef Umar. The Islamic University of the Maldives presented eight programs that they have planned for the academic year 2018 which is targeted to students, Islam teacher's community, the Islamic scholars and parents to reduce radicalization and address some controversial subjects

ENHANCING THE ROLE OF IMAMS IN PREVENTING VIOLENT EXTREMISM

Ministry of Islamic Affairs, conducted seventh refresher training program for Imams and Kathibs of Baa. Atoll islands. A total of 28 Imams from 8 islands attended the program. The program was aimed at training the Imams and Khatibs to promote moderate Islamic views and empower Imams to prevent radicalization activities in the island communities. During the program, Ministry of Islamic Affairs distributed special literature materials addressing the pressing issues including the messages against violent extremism. The training program was conducted by senior officials and scholars from the Ministry of Islamic Affair.

YOUTH AGAINST VIOLENT EXTREMISM AND TERRORISM

Regional Alliance for Fostering Youth (RAFY) in collaboration with National Counter Terrorism



Centre, initiated the first Youth Peace Ambassadors program in the Maldives to create a network of young peacemakers throughout the Maldives. The first program was conducted in K. Guraidhoo from 5 April to 06 April 2018. This program was conducted with the support of K.Guraidhoo island council and school management. A total of 70 students participated in the program, aimed at building resilient communities by producing Young Peacemakers Peace Ambassadors and sustainable development. Furthermore. program prepared the youth to enhance their understanding the shortcomings and achievements of the UN's MDGs, and the potential and challenges of the new Global Post-2015 framework and the SDGs and is in line with the UN Secretary General's call on 12th April 2018, to invest in youth to counter terrorism.
